Answer questions on a separate sheet of paper:

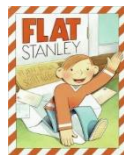
1. What was the author's main purpose for writing the story?

Continue to review additions and subtraction problems.

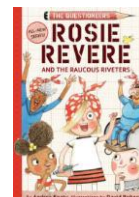

2nd Grade – Choose one book out of three books and answer questions on a separate sheet of paper:

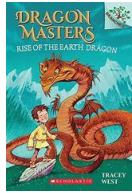
